Champion - Director Chair
Reserve Champion - Saddle Pad

General Rules

1. For horse show purposes, the age of an exhibitor will be considered as of December 1, 2007.
2. All exhibitors must appear in proper attire.
3. All riders cannot ride anywhere on the showgrounds without wearing protective headgear passing ASTM-SEI standards. Harnesses must be secured and if headgear has a brim it must be flexible or semi-flexible. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until their headgear is properly in place.
4. Cross entering between Pleasure classes and Hunter classes is permitted.
5. Management reserves the right to change the location of any class if necessary and to cancel or combine any classes if entries so warrant.
6. NO person will be allowed in the ring during judging unless on official business.
7. The State of Maryland requires that all horses and ponies must be in possession of a current negative Coggins Certificate taken within 12 months.
8. Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons will be awarded in all divisions.
9. Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes.
10. Entry Fee will be \$10.00 per class.

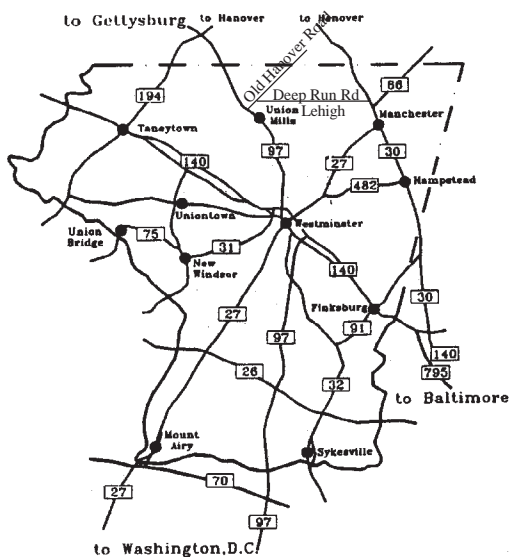

From Baltimore: From Route 695 take Route 795 which turns into Route 140 toward Westminister. Go 13 miles to Westminister and turn right on Route 97 North toward Gettysburg. Turn Right on Old Hanover Road and Right on Deep Run Road. Look for big white sign on left that says "Lehigh Riding Club", but turn Right at sign (private driveway up the hill).

From Gettysburg: Take Route 97 South and go straight through Littlestown. Turn Left on Old Hanover Road and Right on Deep Run Road. Look for big white sign on left that says "Lehigh Riding Club", but turn Right at sign (private driveway up the hill).

From Hanover: Take Route 116 which turns into Route 30 at the Maryland Line. Turn right on Deep Run Road. Look for big white sign on right that says "Lehigh Riding Club", but turn Left at sign (private driveway up the hill).

Long Stirrup Equitation Division

Open to riders 11 years of age and over. To be judged 50% on hands and seat and 50% on mount's quietness and suitability. *Riders may only compete in the Long Stirrup Equitation, Low Hunter and Pleasure Divisions.*

Class 1- Long Stirrup Equitation Walk-Trot - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. No martingales.

Class 2- Long Stirrup Equitation Under Saddle - Shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Class 3- Long Stirrup Equitation Over Fences - To be shown over 6-8 fences 18" in height. Martingales permitted.

Low Horse Hunter Division

Open to horses only. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 4- Low Horse Hunter Walk-Trot - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. No martingales.

Class 5- Low Horse Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Class 6- Low Horse Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 4 crossrails 18" in height. Trotting is permitted.

Class 7- Low Horse Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 4 crossrails 18" in height. Trotting is permitted.

Pleasure Horse Division

Open to horses only. To be judged on performance, manners, and soundness with emphasis on suitability. No martingales.

Class 8- Pleasure Horse Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

Class 9- Pleasure Horse Combination - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter and jump 2 fences 2' in height.

Class 10- Pleasure Horse Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' in height.

Hopeful Hunter Division

Open to horses only. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 11- Hopeful Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'0" in height.

Class 12- Hopeful Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'0" in height.

Class 13- Hopeful Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Schooling Hunter Division

Open to horses only. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 14- Schooling Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'3" or 2'6" in height.

Class 15- Schooling Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'3" or 2'6" in height.

Class 16- Schooling Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Children/Adult Hunter Division

Open to riders 17 years of age and under and Adult Amateurs on horses. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 17- Children/Adult Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'3" or 2'6" in height.

Class 18- Children/Adult Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'3" or 2'6" in height.

Class 19- Children/Adult Hunter U/Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Open Equitation Division

Open to riders 14 years of age and over as of December 1st. To be judged on hands, seat, legs, general position and control. Additional tests may be given.

Class 20- Open Equitation Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingale.

Class 21- Open Equitation Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'6" in height.

Special Hunter Division

Open to horses. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 22- Special Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'9" or 3' in height.

Class 23- Special Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2'9" or 3' in height.

Class 24- Special Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Open Hunter Division

Open to horses only. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 25- Open Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 3' or 3'3" in height.

Class 26- Open Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 3' or 3'3" in height.

Class 27- Open Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Lead Line Division

Open to riders 7 years of age and under. Riders to be mounted on ponies 14.2 hands and under. To be judged 50% on child's hands and seat and 50% on mount's quietness and suitability. No martingales. *Riders may only compete in the Lead Line and Mini Short Stirrup Walk and Walk-Halt classes.*

Class 28- Lead Line - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk with leadline attached.

Class 29- Lead Line Walk - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk with leadline unattached.

Mini Short Stirrup Division

Open to riders 9 years of age and under. Riders to be mounted on ponies 14.2 hands and under. To be judged 50% on child's hands and seat and 50% on mount's quietness and suitability. No martingales. *Riders may only compete in the Mini Short Stirrup Division.*

Class 30- Mini Short Stirrup Walk - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk.

Class 31- Mini Short Stirrup Walk-Halt - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and halt in one direction..

Class 32- Mini Short Stirrup Walk-Trot-Pony - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Judged on the pony.

Class 33- Mini Short Stirrup Walk-Trot-Equitation - Shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. Judged on equitation.

Short Stirrup Equitation Division

Open to riders 10 years of age and under. To be judged 50% on hands and seat and 50% on mount's quietness and suitability. *Riders may only compete in the Short Stirrup Equitation, Crossrail Hunter and Pleasure Divisions.*

Class 34- Short Stirrup Equitation Walk-Trot - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk and trot. No martingales.

Class 35- Short Stirrup Equitation Under Saddle - Shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Class 36- Short Stirrup Equitation Over Fences - To be shown over 6-8 fences 18" in height. Martingales permitted.

Crossrail Hunter Division

Open to horses and ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 37- Crossrail Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 18" in height.

Class 38- Crossrail Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 18" in height.

Class 38- Crossrail Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Equitation 13 and Under Division

Open to riders who have not reached their 14th birthday. To be judged on hands, seat, legs, general position and control. Additional tests may be given.

Class 40- Equitation 13 and under Under Saddle - Shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingale.

Class 41- Equitation 13 and under Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' in height.

Low Pony Hunter Division

Open to riders 17 years of age and under on ponies 14.2 hands and under. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness.

Class 42- Low Pony Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' in height.

Class 43- Low Pony Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' in height.

Class 44- Low Pony Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Pleasure Pony Division

Open to riders 17 years of age and under on ponies 13.2 hands and under. To be judged on performance, manners, and soundness with emphasis on suitability. No martingales.

Class 45- Pleasure Pony Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

Class 46- Pleasure Pony Combination - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter and jump 2 fences 2' in height.

Class 47- Pleasure Pony Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' in height.

Pony Hunter Division

Open to riders 17 years of age and under on ponies 14.2 hands and under. To be judged on performance, manners, suitability and soundness. Small/Medium Pony to jump 2'; Large Pony to jump 2'6" in height.

Class 48- Pony Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' - 2'6" in height.

Class 49- Pony Hunter Over Fences - To be shown over 8 fences 2' - 2'6" in height.

Class 50- Pony Hunter Under Saddle - To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. No martingales.

Low Jumper Division

Open to horses or ponies. To be run in accordance with USEF Table II, Section 2(b).

Class 51 - Low Jumper - To be shown over 8 fences 2' to 2'3" in height.

Class 52 - Low Jumper - To be shown over 8 fences 2' to 2'3" in height.

Hopeful Jumper Division

Open to horses or ponies. To be run in accordance with USEF Table II, Section 2(b).

Class 53 - Hopeful Jumper - To be shown over 8 fences 2'6" to 2'6" in height.

Class 54 - Hopeful Jumper - To be shown over 8 fences 2'6" to 2'6" in height.

Procedure for Breaking Ties - End-of-Series Awards

- **Pleasure and Hunter Divisions** (Low Horse Hunter, Pleasure Horse, Schooling Hunter, Children/Adult Hunter, Special Hunter, Open Hunter, Crossrail Hunter, Pleasure Pony, Low Pony Hunter, Pony Hunter).

Step One - In case of a tie score for the “End-of-Series Award”, the Champion is awarded to the horse/pony accumulating the most points *over fences*. If horses/ponies have equal number of points over fences, go to Step 2.

Step Two - The tied horses/ponies will receive points for *Champion* and *Reserve Champion* at each of the four shows as follows:

Champion - 15 points Reserve Champion - 10 points

If horses/ponies still have equal number of points, go to Step 3.

Step Three - The tied horses/ponies must be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. In the event a horse/pony is not present to hack, said horse/pony will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

- **Long Stirrup and Short Stirrup Divisions**

Step One - In case of a tie score for the “End-of-Series Award”, the Champion is awarded to the rider accumulating the most points *over fences*. If riders have equal number of points over fences, go to Step 2.

Step Two - The tied riders will receive points for *Champion* and *Reserve Champion* at each of the four shows as follows:

Champion - 15 points Reserve Champion - 10 points

If riders still have equal number of points, go to Step 3.

Step Three - The tied riders must be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. In the event a rider is not present to hack, said rider will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

- **Mini Short Stirrup Division**

Step One - In case of a tie score for the “End-of-Series Award”, the Champion is awarded to the rider accumulating the most points in *Mini Short Stirrup Walk-Trot*. If riders have equal number of points, go to Step 2.

Step Two - The tied riders will receive points for *Champion* and *Reserve Champion* at each of the four shows as follows:

Champion - 15 points Reserve Champion - 10 points

If riders still have equal number of points, go to Step 3.

Step Three - The tied riders must be shown at a walk and trot both ways of the ring. In the event a rider is not present to hack, said rider will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

- **Lead Line Division**

Step One - In case of a tie score for the “End-of-Series Award”, the Champion is awarded to the rider accumulating the most points in *Lead Line Walk*. If riders have equal number of points, go to Step 2.

Step Two - The tied riders will receive points for *Champion* and *Reserve Champion* at each of the four shows as follows:

Champion - 15 points Reserve Champion - 10 points

If riders still have equal number of points, go to Step 3.

Step Three - The tied riders must be shown at a walk, off the leadline with a sidewalker. In the event a rider is not present to hack, said rider will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

• **Equitation Divisions**

Step One - In case of a tie score for the “End-of-Series Award”, the Champion is awarded to the rider accumulating the most points *over fences*. If riders have equal number of points over fences, go to Step 2.

Step Two - The tied riders will receive points for *Champion* and *Reserve Champion* at each of the four shows as follows:

Champion - 15 points Reserve Champion - 10 points

If riders still have equal number of points, go to Step 3.

Step Three - The tied riders must be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. In the event a rider is not present to hack, said rider will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

• **Jumper Division**

Step One - The tied horses/ponies will be jumped off according to the following class: Fault and Out. The competitor’s round finishes with the first fault incurred under Table II. Points are awarded instead of faults, two points being awarded for each obstacle jumped clean and one point for the obstacle knocked down. The winner is the competitor who scores the greatest number of points. Time will decide in the event of equality of points. In the event a horse/pony is not present to jump-off, said horse/pony will forfeit the End-of-Series Award.

Trophy to be awarded to the pony/rider combination who accumulates the most points in the following divisions: Pleasure Pony, Low Pony Hunter, and Pony Hunter.
